



JUDGMENT

THIS IS an application under Section 50A(1) of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950 to settle a scheme in respect of the trust known and designated as St. Luke's Hospital situated at Shirirapur, District Ahmednagar and registered at No. E-30 (Ahmednagar.)

2/- The facts of the case are that St. Luke's Hospital is duly registered as public trust in the year 1952. It is being run there since then and all types patients are admitted in the said Hospital. At present there are 180 patients in user and more than 600 out-door patients treated every day.

3/- The application for registration of the said trust was filed by
Smt. Christine in the year 1952. She gave the necessary details in
respect of the Hospital in question and mentioned herself as the sole
trustee of the said trust. There was a building possessed by the trust
in which the Hospital was run. While giving details, the mode of
succession was desribed to the effect that the trustee be appointed by
the Medical Mission Institute of Ahmednagar. The said inquiry was disposed
of by the Learned Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona who ordered the said
Hospital to be registered as a public trust and also gave his findings on
the other statutory issues. Thereafter it so happened that some additional
trustees were appointed and at present there are four trustees of this trust
in the management of the affairs of the said Hospital. Meanwhile it appears
from the record of this trust that an inspection was taken by the Asstt.
Charity Commissioner, Poona and at that time he noticed some irregularities
and further he also found out that there are no proper Rules and Regulations
for the management of the Hospital. Thereafter it appears that some Change
Reports were filed by the trustees of the said trust requesting to take on
record the Rules and Regulations of the Hospital, being Change Report No. 667/73.
However, the said Change Report was not accepted because the Rules were not filed along
with the registration application. It is therefore that the present application
is filed by the trustees requesting to settle a scheme for the management
of the said Hospital. The trustees have also given the draft of the scheme for
Charity Commissioner's approval.

4/- Hence the issues for my determinations are as follows :-

i) Whether it is necessary, expedient and in the interest of the
trust to settle a scheme ?

ii) What scheme should be settled ?


5/- My findings are as follows :-

i) Yes.

REASONS

6/- ... On going through the record and proceedings of this trust I find



I find that there are neither any Rules nor any constitution nor any scheme framed for the Hospital. It is not kept in proper management. I have, for this trust for want of which it is rather difficult to carry on the activities of any public trust. Further it appears that when the Asstt.

Charity Commissioner took the inspection of this trust he also noticed that there are no Rules and hence he give directions to the trustees in that behalf. It is thereupon that the present application is filed. I have gone through the record and I find that this Hospital is doing very good work in the said city of Shrirampur and many patients residing at Shrirampur and nearby villages are taking advantage of this Hospital. But no rules have been framed though the Hospital is running there for the last more than 25 years. I am therefore of the view that a scheme is absolutely necessary and give my finding in the affirmative on issue No. 1.

7/ The next point is as to what scheme should be settled? Two points will have to be considered in this behalf. One is the mode of succession and the other is the appointment of trustees under the scheme. I shall first discuss the question of mode of succession. Now it is seen that in the draft scheme the trustees have suggested that the trustees be appointed only for the period of five years and that the election should take place and the new trustees be elected from the members of the Medical Mission Institute which is another trust registered as a public trust. However, I feel that this may not be the proper mode of succession. No useful purpose will be served by appointing trustees by way of periodical election which may prevent the smooth working and functions of the Hospital due to change of trustees. I am therefore of the view that for the smooth working of the Institution like Hospital it is advisable to have permanent trustees who shall be entirely in the management of the affairs of the Hospital. When the trustees are permanent they can decide a particular policy regarding the functions of the Hospital and carry on the same neatly and properly. Therefore so far the mode of succession is concerned I hold that the trustees shall be permanent and if any vacancy takes place due to death, resignation or otherwise of any of the trustees then, in case of such a vacancy, Surviving Trustees shall submit the report to the Society of Medical Institute Shegaon.

District Ahmednagar, which is registered as a public trust and it will be for the said Institute to fill in the said vacancy and to appoint a new trustee. I however, further put the condition that if any such vacancy occurs in future the same shall be filled in within three months from the occurrence of such event failing which it shall be lawful for the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona to fill in the said vacancy after calling a report and the names of suitable persons from the Inspector of Ahmednagar District. I accordingly incorporate all these provisions in the scheme that is settled.



S/- I shall then refer to the question of appointment of trustees under the scheme. Now it is seen that there are already 4 trustees on the record and therefore their names will have to be taken in the scheme. However at this stage I refer to the number of trustees. I find from the record that formerly there was one trustee. Now there are four trustees and no specific number is fixed. It is necessary to fix the number of trustees so that there is no difficulty for the appointment of trustees. At the same time I feel that four trustees will not be sufficient in future as the activities of the Hospital are increasing day by day and therefore it will be necessary to have more number of trustees to manage the increasing activities of the Hospital. I therefore hold that there shall be minimum of 3 and maximum of 7 trustees. Now there are already four trustees on the record and therefore it will be necessary to appoint three more trustees. I therefore direct the present four trustees to appoint three more trustees in consultation with the Society of Medical Mission Institute Shegaon, Ahmednagar and after making these appointments they shall submit the Change Report to Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona under Section 22 of the Act to bring on record the names of three newly appointed trustees. I, however, direct that they shall make these appointments within the period of six months from the sanction of the scheme failing which it shall be lawful for the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona to appoint the said three trustees. Therefore the present four trustees who are already on the record plus three more trustees to be appointed either by the

by the present trustees or by the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona totalling 7 shall form the first Board of Trustees under the Scheme. I accordingly incorporate all these provisions in the scheme that is settled.

9/- I shall then refer to the objects of the trust. When this trust was registered as a public trust in the year 1954 the objects were briefly mentioned as medical relief. It is necessary to elaborate these objects so that they are properly followed by the trustees in their day to day management and administration of a public trust. In this behalf I refer to clause No. 5 of the draft scheme submitted by the applicants wherein they have enumerated the objects of the trust. I have gone through the same and I find that the objects as specified therein are quite alright and they are in keeping with the purposes of the trust. Hence I accept these objects and incorporate in the scheme that is settled.

10/- As regards the other clauses of the scheme I have carefully perused the draft scheme submitted by the applicants. However, I do not approve the same as some of the important clauses which are necessary for the management of a public trust are lacking in the said scheme. Moreover the scheme submitted by the applicants requires modifications in view of the decision decision taken by me as regards the mode of succession, appointment of trustees, the objects of the trust etc. Hence I settle a new scheme altogether incorporating all the relevant clauses which are necessary for the day to day management and administration of a public trust.

11/- I therefore, give my findings as above and pass the following order.

ORDER

I hereby settle a scheme in respect of the above trust annexed at Ex. A to the Judgment. The affairs of the trust shall henceforth be governed by the provisions of the said scheme. No orders as to costs.

SCHEME FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF
ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL SITUATED AT SHRIRAMPUR,
DISTRICT AHMEDNAGAR.

PUBLIC TRUSTS REGISTRATION NO. E-80 (AHMEDNAGAR)

1/- Name, Registration No. & Registered Office of the trust:-

This public charitable trust shall be designated and known by the name of "St. Luke's Hospital" situated at Shrirkapur, District Ahmednagar, hereinafter referred to as the said trust and same is registered at No. E-80 (Ahmednagar) at Public Trusts Registration Office, Poona Region, Poona. The registered office of the said trust shall be situated at the premises of Hospital, Dist. Ahmednagar.

2. Properties of the trust:-

The properties of the trust consist of the immovable and movable properties mentioned in schedule hereto and such other properties which belong to the said trust which may through error, oversight or inadvertence have remained to be mentioned in the schedules. All these properties and new accretions thereto acquisitions and donations, ~~and also offerings before the trustees~~ either in cash or kind received hereafter shall be called "The trust properties."

3/- Vesting of the trust property:-

The trust properties shall vest in the trustees for the time being under this scheme and shall be administered and managed by them subject to and in conformity with the provisions of this scheme.

4. Objects of the trust:-

The objects of the trust shall be as follows:-

- 1) To manage and administer the St. Luke's Hospital or any other Hospitals, dispensaries, Nursing Homes, Health Care Programs, Preventive and promotive Health Services.
- ii) To support and promote the advancement of medical education training of General Nurses, Auxiliary Nurses, X Ray Lab Technicians etc.
- iii) To engage in any Emergency programme in the medical and social line
- iv) To provide, support and administer medical and social centers and other charitable objects.

To engage in all the above activities without distinction of class, & creed or religious.

Number of trustees :-

The number of trustees shall be not less than 3 and more than 7.

First trustees :-

The following shall be the first Board of trustees of the trust under scheme :-

- i) Sister Christine Ott,
- ii) * Anne Reitner,
- iii) * Misela Guenther,
- iv) * Jennakutty Bawa Christine,

The above four trustees shall appoint three more trustees in consultation a Society of Medical Mission Institute, Dist. Aherdhnagar within the period six months from the sanction of the scheme failing which it shall be lawful the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona to appoint three trustees. Hence above four trustees along with the three more trustees to be appointed either the trustees of by the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona totalling seven will form the first Board of Trustees of the trust under the Scheme.

Qualification of trustees :-

Any male or female adult ~~person belonging to any community but preferably~~ who is the member of the Medical Service Society of the Medical Mission Institute, George Town (P.M.I.S), residing within the ~~vicinity~~ vicinity of Shrivaspur shall be eligible to be the trustee of the said trust.

Disqualification of the trusteeship :-

The trustees of the said trust shall disqualified if :-

- i) He or she acts against the interest and objects of the trust and does not abide by the Scheme and rules and regulations framed thereunder.
- ii) He or she is convicted of criminal offence involving moral turpitude or offence under the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950.
- iii) He or she resigns or dies.

Appointment of new Trustees when vacancies arise :-

Whenever any trustees either original or substituted under the scheme will during their tenure of trusteeship die or be absent for six consecutive

trust properties and income and shall get the accounts audited and filed with the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona Region, Poona, in accordance with the provisions of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950.

24. Bank Accounts :-

1) The trust funds and the moneys shall be invested in accordance with the provisions of section. 35 of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950 and the trustees shall also have power to convert securities of one type into other subject to the said provisions of the Act.

2) i) The trustees shall not ordinarily keep on hand more than Rs. 5000/- (Five thousand).

iii) All accounts in the Bank shall be maintained in the name of the trust and if that is not possible or practicable in the name of the trustees. Such accounts shall be operated jointly at least by two of the trustees as determined by the Board of Trustees.

25. Power to sell, mortgage, etc.

The trustees shall have power to sell, mortgage, exchange gift or lease out any immovable property belonging to the trust subject to the conditions and restriction as laid down by section 36 of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950.

26. Register of movable and immovables :-

The trustees shall maintain in a pages bound book complete list of the movable and immovable properties of the trust ~~now~~ mentioned in schedule of this scheme and shall keep it up-to-date by making additions to the same and when new properties are purchased or acquired or disposed by the trust. Such first list or register shall be signed by all the trustees and by any new trustee when appointed. Trustees shall physically verify the list or register at least once in two year.

27. Collecting Money

....(Contd. .8..)

The trustees shall in the name of the trust collect money from the temples, mosques, churches, synagogues, etc. and other places and also collect money from the visitors to the trust by the means of collection boxes or otherwise. The trustees shall keep a record of the amount collected and the amount deposited in the bank. The trustees shall also keep a record of the amount deposited in the bank.

27. Power to appoint the employees i.e.

The trustees shall have power to appoint Manager, Accountant, Clerks, Agents, and other servants or employees as they may require for the management of the trust on such terms and conditions as to salary, wages, dearness, allowances etc. as the trustees may consider proper for the purposes of carrying on the trust and shall have full power to dismiss any such employee as they think fit and proper, in their discretion. The payments appointed as aforesaid shall be paid in cash and not in kind.

28. Residential licence to the employees i.e.

The trustees may allow any servant of the Trust appointed by them to occupy such room or rooms as their licensee on such terms and conditions as they may deem fit and proper.

29. Receiving of subscriptions or donations i.e.

The trustees shall be at liberty to accept either unconditionally or upon such conditions as they may approve of, as shall not be inconsistent with or calculated to impede the due working of the scheme, any subscription and or donation in money or in kind in aid or for the purpose of the said trust or for charitable object mentioned in Clause 4 of the scheme.

30. Liability of the trustees i.e.

The trustees shall be respectively chargeable only for such moneys and securities as they shall respectively, actually receive notwithstanding, their respectively signing any receipt or ~~receipt~~ cheque for the same in conformity and shall not be answerable or responsible for the acts, receipt, omissions, neglects and defaults of any banker, broker, auctioner or other person with whom or into whose hands any trust moneys or securities shall be deposited or come for any other loss unless the same shall happen through their own negligence, default or omissions, breach of trust, misapplication or misconduct.

31. Reimbursement of trustees i.e.

The trustees or trustee for the time being may reimburse themselves of himself or pay and discharge out of the trust properties all expenses incurred in or about the execution of the trust or power under this scheme or any of them. The



The trust or trustees shall be also entitled to allow their co-trustees or trustees all costs, charges and expenses which they or any of them shall or may suffer or sustain in or about the execution of the said trust and powers or in relation thereto and also either before or after the appointment of any new trustee or trustees as aforesaid to settle, adjust, and allow the amount any such trustee or trustees.

Provided however, that this right and/or power of the reimbursement shall not be operative in case of trustee or trustees who are held liable for loss caused to the trust for their acts or omissions

33. Power to frame rules :-

The trustees shall have power from time to time to make such rules and regulations as they may think fit and proper for the administration and carrying into effect of the provisions of this scheme and to provide for the management of the trust and its properties and also from time to time alter any such rules or regulations or to repeal any of them and substitute other in their place provided always that no such rules or regulations as framed or subsequently amended shall in any manner be inconsistent with any of the provisions of this scheme or the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950 or the Rules made thereunder.

Provided further that the rules or amendments thereto framed by the trustees under this clause shall not come into operation unless a copy of it certified to be true copy of by at least two of the trustees has been filed with the Asstt. Charity Commissioner, Poona Region, Poona and a receipt thereof is obtained.

34. Reference to the Charity Commissioner, Bombay in case of disputes:-

If any dispute arise about the interpretation of any of the clauses of the Scheme, the matter will be referred to the Charity Commissioner, Bombay whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

JUDGMENT.

This is an inquiry under Section 50 A (3) of
the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950, filed by the above-named
applicants on dated 30-6-1989, at Exhibit 1.

2. The facts involved in the present case are that
the trust viz. St. Luke's Hospital, Shrirampur, District
Ahmednagar, is duly registered under the provisions of the
Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950 which bears Public Trusts
Registration No. E - 80 (Ahmednagar). It came into
existence for carrying out the Medical Activities. The trust
is running one Hospital at Shrirampur. When the trust was

the Clause by incorporating one more line in the qualifications of the trustees. The President of Our Lady Pilar, Bombay has also given their consent for the amendment they are ready to render their services to the trust. Therefore, it is requested that the application be allowed and the amendment suggested in the application be incorporated in the Scheme. The applicants have filed the copy of Resolution at Ex. 1, along with the Statistic of the hospital, copy of the President of Our Lady Pilar, Bombay and the copy of the General Body at Exhibits 2 to 4, respectively.

3. The documents produced before me are at Exhibits 1 to 5.

4. On going through the documents and the facts on record, the following points arise for my determination :

(1) Whether an amendment is essential in Clause No. 7 of the Scheme framed by the Learned Deputy Charity Commissioner, Maharashtra State, Bombay.

6. REAS NS FOR FINDINGS


It is a matter of record that the trust is duly registered under the provisions of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950. It bears Public Trusts Registration No. E - 80 (Ahmednagar). It came into existence for carrying out the Medical Activities. The trust is running one Hospital at Shrirampur, Tq. Shrirampur, District Ahmednagar. The applicants have given the Statistic of the In-door patients

and Out-door patients which shows that the activities of the trust are enhanced day by day. The patients who were visiting the Hospital, are also more and more which can be seen from the Statistic. Previously, there were only 25 Beds. But, now, there are more than 200 beds. This fact goes to show that the activities of the trust increased day by day. In these circumstances, it is incumbent upon the trustees to increase the staff and the other facilities in the Hospital. ^{Without} ~~Except~~ the staff, the patients cannot be attended. Whenever, there is an increase in the staff, naturally, there will be burden of payments on the trust. Whenever, there is an increase in the facilities like Operation Theatre, Obstetric Department, Laboratory, X - ray Department and Technicians, naturally, there would be burden on the financial position of the trust. On the contrary, the trust is running this Hospital as a Charity and on the basis of no profit and no loss. The income of the trust is not self-sufficient to meet with all the problems arised out of the above-mentioned circumstances. In these circumstances, to meet with the problems and to over-come, the trustees have held their meeting on dated the 1st of June, 1989 in which it was decided to amend the Clause No. 7 of the Scheme. The Clause No. 7 of the Scheme reads as under :

* Qualification of trustees :

Any female adult who is the member of the medical service society of the medical mission institute Shevgaon, preferably residing within the vicinity of Shriramgur, shall be eligible to become the trustee of the said trust. "

The said clause shows that only the member of medical mission of secular institution, Shevgaon can become a



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trustees of this trust. If the Clause is amended and the sentence i.e. " and any member of the public trust, Our Lady of Pilar, Bombay, shall also be eligible to become trustee of the said trust " will be added to the said Clause No. 7 of the Scheme, the scope of the qualifications of the trustees would be increased, Not merely the scope of qualifications of the trustees increased but the trustees ~~now~~ who would be appointed as trustees may able to render their services to the trust. Moreover, the said members would render their services either freely or ~~at~~ a little costs. The applicant has already pointed out that the members of Our Lady Pilar, Bombay are already rendering and offering their services in the Hospital. Moreover, the President of Our Lady Pilar, Bombay has also given his consent at Ex. 3. By increasing the scope of qualifications of trustees, if the problems arised in the efficient management of the trust, would be solved. I do not find any harm to ~~in~~ incorporate the said sentence in the clause of Qualifications of the trustees. I do find it essential that the activities of the trust and the problems arised before the trust, must be solved. The activities of the trust are charitable and the Charity is the main object of the said trust. I find that the cause is supported by substantial ground. Hence, I pass the following orders :

O R D E R .

1. The application is allowed.
2. Amendment in Clause No. 7 " Qualifications of the trustees ", be incorporated.
3. Applicant be informed accordingly.
